As the reconstruction begins, Think Pavers Hardscaping's President, Nicholas Furfari stated they will begin with a demolition of a 30-wide strip of concrete in all three blocks beginning with the 300 block. Moving into the week of November 26<sup>th</sup>, 2007 they would install a new water main.
